Pristly, I'd like to extend my sincere gratitude to those of you who provided invaluable feedback and especially to those parents who took the time to meet with me to discuss the proposed changes to our Breakfast Club. Your insights have been instrumental in shaping the changes we're implementing.

I'm pleased to announce that after careful consideration of the feedback received, the times for the Breakfast Club will remain 7.40am - 8.55am. This decision has been taken keeping in mind the pivotal role the club plays in supporting our local community.

From **Monday**, Breakfast Club will be hosted in the mobile building that was previously the home to our Reception Class. This location is self-contained, equipped with its own kitchen area, toilets, and activity spaces, making it an ideal environment for morning activities. As part of our efforts to strengthen safeguarding and manage numbers efficiently:

- Children attending the Breakfast Club will need to be dropped off by an adult. This measure, although it might be a slight shift for some parents, is primarily to ensure the safety of your children.
- We encourage parents to register their children in advance and ensure payments are made either upon arrival each day or at the start of the week. While we're gradually moving towards tightening up further on advance registration, we'll continue to admit children who arrive spontaneously for now.

The goal behind these changes is not only to enhance the experience for our pupils but also to address the challenges we've faced, such as the inconsistencies in arrivals and payments. While we're striving to maintain the informal nature of Breakfast Club, these adjustments aim to provide a safer, more organised, and effective environment for everyone involved.

Thank you for your understanding and ongoing support. We believe these changes will greatly improve the overall provision of the Breakfast Club while maintaining its essence.
