Writing Tasks - LET'S WRITE A RECOUNT

- * Look at the attached poster this is helpful as it has all the things you need to write a recount. This is a bit like our writers toolkit!
- * One thing to remember with a recount is that it is a record of something that happened in the past. Remember when we looked at suffix ed? This helps us turn verbs (doing words) into doing something in the past.
- * Play the suffix -ed game attached and turn the verbs into the past tense.
- * Watch <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3LSJWKHoXDw> again and look at the picture below. Can you write a message in a bottle to Jim Lad?
- * Try writing about your day/weekend and some of the fun things you have been up to at home. Remember to write what happened, first, next, then, after that and use Suffix -ed. Eg I played in the garden with my sister.
- * Once your message has been written, tea stain the message so it looks just like an old pirate map and send to Miss Carter at enquiries@willaston.sch.im

Maths focus

I have attached 2 powerpoint for maths which should have enough learning opportunities for 4 days. This week we are focusing on weight and mass along with volume and capacity. Key vocabulary to use with your child is shown in each powerpoint. Here are some extra practical activities to do at home alongside the powerpoint. When talking about capacity remember that is how much a container holds.

Estimation station! Set up an estimation station: put out different containers eg cups, bowls etc and 1 substance to put in it eg rice, lentils, pasta water. Which container do you think will hold the most? How can you test? How will you know which one holds more or less? Could you use something you can count? Try with lego or teddies.

Pirate science

This week we will be investigating pirate coins and treasure!! Look at the next page for the investigation and what you will need.

Investigating...

Fizzy Pirate Coins

You will need:



Method:

1. Clean some pennies to be shiny pirate coins, to do this place them in cola or vinegar.
2. For the rocks, pour your baking soda into a bowl and add water slowly until it makes a paste. (If you want to pad out the baking soda, add some flour when you mix. As long as it's not more than half and half you should still get a good reaction).
3. Add a couple of drops of food colouring and mix well.
4. Either mould with your hands or use cake moulds to create shapes, press a coin into each.
5. Leave in the fridge overnight.
6. Use a dropper to drop vinegar onto your pirate rocks.



The Science Bit



Why does this happen? Vinegar (an acid) and Bicarbonate of soda (an alkali), react together to neutralise each other. This reaction releases carbon dioxide gas, which causes the bubbles you see.

Which worked best at cleaning the coins? The cola or vinegar?
