Writing Tasks - A Day In The Life of a Pirate

*Now you have planned what Pirates love to do during the day using a story map - can you now write your day in the life of a pirate! Pretty please can you send me a copy of your final pieces - I would love to see them tea stained like real pirates and in as much detail as you can. Try and do this as independently as you can :)

This is the Phonics channel on you tube and this is how I would teach phonics in school Your child can watch this from 9am - 10:30 with the different speed sounds lessons I would recommend set 2 and set 3 sounds.

I have attached powerpoint presentations to practice speed sounds, learn a new sound, Red words, Green words and writing practice.

** play IRE ON FIRE! - This is great fun! You will need chalk, a water gun or a paint brush and water. Write the words below on a wall or pavement. Now you need to squirt only the words that have the new sound ire in it - they are on fire!

Maths focus - As with last week - we are focussing on fractions and mainly finding half. Remember this is when the whole is split into 2 equal (same) parts. Last week you have made a mind map of everything you know to do with half. This week I have attached a powerpoint and this mainly focuses on finding half of amounts. If you have it at home or on Netflix, watch the film Matilda. In this film there is a part, where Miss Honey is talking about her dads delicious chocolate box. She says "he would take a knife, cut it in half, and he would always give me the bigger half". Miss honey is a teacher, so she should be right about halves... but is she? The bigger half? Can this ever be right? Is there ever a bigger half? Work through the powerpoint and see if you can answer this question and prove it! **Make a sandwich together and cut into halves. What shapes are the halves? If you do it another way, what shape do they make now? Is it still half?

TERRIFIC TREES!

More on plants this week - but this time we are looking up instead of down - Yes we are looking at trees! Trees are plants too you know!

Instead of a plant hunt - we are going on a Tree Hunt! Use the sheets attached to see if you can spot any of these trees.

Use the attached powerpoint to have a look and see which ones you found? Did you find a deciduous tree or an evergreen tree? The Clue is looking at the leaves! Are they thick and waxy? Or are they thin?

Number formation - please see the attached powerpoint to help form numbers correctly.


Follow White Rose Maths on Facebook - join Year 1 maths group. Each day there will be activities posted to facebook specifically for year 1.
