



## Year 2 Willaston Weekly Distance Learning Week 1



### Daily Reading

Ensure your child reads everyday, access Oxford Owls for your books as they are similar to the Guided Reading books that we send home every week. Check that they are sounding out the words correctly and using picture clues to help. Point out the different punctuation marks and check the children can retell the story in the correct order.

### Writing Tasks - Fiction

Continue with the story map planning you have been doing in class about your own dragon. Write your own story version of the Manchester Ridgeback. (I have attached the original text that we have been using and our class planning sheet.)

**Remember:** We were looking at including time connectives and sentences that contain lots of description. As always, you need capital letters, full stops and finger spaces.

### Writing Task - Non fiction

After you have written your dragon story, change this into a non - chronological report. Remember we have looked at lots of different ones and picked out how they are set out differently to a story. I have attached some examples.

**Remember:** It must have a title, sub titles, fact boxes, labelled diagrams.

### Phonic focus

Daily work on identifying and saying Set 2 and 3 speed sounds.

Recap on 'tion' and 'ure' words. How many can the children remember and spell? - Can they come up with any others or find more from their books?

Write sentences that contain these words in the correct context. However, the funnier the better

### Maths focus

This week we are continuing to work on multiplication and division. The main focus for each lesson is written at the top of the attached power point slides. Each presentation has enough activities to last for 2 days and there are questions that will extend the children's thinking on the end slides. You could ask your child to come up with their own questions to solve and get them to explain the answer and their thinking to you.

Also explore the different websites on the remote learning page - my favourite is the Mathematics Shed, especially the lego maths section! You can also use lego pieces to help teach the multiplication and division work - use them as cubes.

### Topic/Science

- Find out about different habitats and the animals that live there. What do they eat and how are they suited for that particular habitat? - Maybe you could look in your garden and see what you can find in that habitat? You could link this into your non fiction writing and present your findings as a non-chronological report.
- Find out all you can about China and what life is like there. How is it the same / different to the Isle of Man?
- Make your own junk model dragon or puppet, if you are feeling creative.

### Ongoing ideas to support your year 2 child -

Practice and recall 2, 5 and 10 times tables.

Number bonds to 10 and then 100

Practice letter formation and correct joins.

Read and spell sight words.
