



## Year 2 Willaston Weekly Distance Learning Week 8



### Reading

This week I have uploaded a book as a pdf document on the website called - **Don't Hog the Hedge**. It is also available as an audio book via this link <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9HIGSbw-HKU>. There are a selection of questions you could ask your child, while they are reading. The follow-up activities support the previous learning about nouns, verbs, tenses, suffixes, phonics and punctuation. As always, continue to use [oxfordowl.co.uk](http://oxfordowl.co.uk) to access additional Guided Reading books.

### Literacy -Poetry

Using adjectives and expanded noun phrases can you describe all the pictures of aliens that I have uploaded on the website. Focus on the different body parts and come up with full sentences that describe them in detail.

Next, I want you to make your own alien, you could cut up different pictures and mix them altogether or you could draw your own. Now, we are ready to start to write our own poem. I have written my version on the next page, notice, how I have described what the alien looks like, with the numbers of its different body parts. I have included some words that rhyme with each other. Can you pick out where the rhyming words are in the sentences and spot any patterns? Maybe you could use this structure to help write yours.

When you have finished your poem, learn it and perform it to your adults with lots of exciting actions. You may even want to make props and a costume. I would love to see your final performances.

### Numeracy Maths focus - Fractions

This week we are continuing to look at fractions. The main focus will be recognising and finding a  $\frac{1}{3}$  and finding fractions that are equivalent to  $\frac{1}{2}$  and  $\frac{1}{4}$ . Click on the link <https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/> and go to the bottom of the page - just like last week but click on **WEEK 2**. Run through the 5 daily video lessons and complete the activity sheets that support each lesson. I have also uploaded additional supporting sheets to complete once all the clips have been completed.

### Topic - Science

Last week you looked at the question - **How is sound made?** You were asked to research this and record your ideas into a circle map. This week, I want you to research what the following key vocabulary means: vibrate/vibration, sound waves, volume, pitch, high and low sounds. I have uploaded two science investigations connected to sound. Read through each investigation first and make predictions about what you think will happen. Can you use the science vocabulary that you have researched? Can you explain why and how your investigation worked?

### Topic - Construction

Make your own alien space craft. I have included a set of instructions to help with your ideas but I think you can be even more creative.

### Spelling

Over the last few weeks, you have watched a number of video clips about tenses, verbs, suffixes and punctuation. If you have missed these or forgotten them, then go back and search the previous weeks' planning for the links and watch again. Apply your knowledge from the video clips and complete the sheets connected to this weeks Guided Reading tasks. (Which are uploaded on the website) **Remember you must read the book first**.
