Daily Reading

Ensure your child reads everyday. Check that they are reading accurately and have a clear understanding of what they have read. Ask questions throughout and see what they can recount/remember about what they have been reading. Writing Task - Narrative

Continuing with the classic children's story called "Five Children and It" by E.Nesbit, we are going to build on our learning about the Psammead/ sand fairy that you created last week.

Look at the Psammead week 2 pack and plan your own version of a story based on the Sand Fairy. Answer some questions/ prompts to plan your story and re-read the excerpts from the story to help you. Each day, split up the writing and create your own version- will you write a funny story or a scary story?
