Daily Reading

Ensure your child reads everyday. Check that they are reading accurately and have a clear understanding of what they have read.

Explore some poetry this week. Look on www.poetryfoundation.org for some different poems if you don't have a book at home. Which poems do you like? Why?

Writing Tasks - Fiction

Read the poem titled 'I know Someone' by Michael Rosen. Picture on school website- Year 5 Distance Learning. Can you write your own version of the poem about people you know? Think about how playful you can be with language and which words or actions will describe that person best in one sentence. Can you perform it to a family member? Make a video? Illustrate it?

Writing Task - Non fiction

Write a persuasive advert about someone you know really well. It could be someone in your house/ a favourite character/ a famous person. Imagine you were promoting this person. Why would someone hire them? Think about the persuasive language you need to use. Look at the example on the school website.

Maths focus -

This week we are going to re-visit division. We can divide numbers by either sharing or grouping.

Practise sharing at home with the concrete materials. Can you share equally or do you have some remainders?

- Share out a bag of sweets in to four groups
- Share out a pack of cards between all the members of your household
- Share out clothes pegs into three groups

Can you think of your own 'sharing' challenges?

Can you write number sentences to demonstrate your sharing?

Topic/Science

During our most recent art session at school Miss Rutter showed you how to print using ink and tinfoil.

Your challenge this week is to experiment using resources you have at home to find another way you could create a print. What could you use instead of tinfoil? What will your print design look like? How could you make improvements to your prints each time you have a go?
