#### PAWS

We have an amazing PAWS (Parents at Willaston School) team who work tremendously hard to provide amazing events for our children throughout the year. Further details will follow regarding the first meeting but PLEASE the children need you to step and up and run events. Thank you so much.

## Breakfast Club

Following the retirement of Mrs Quane - who we hope is enjoying being footloose and fancy free, we welcome Mr Corrin to work alongside Mrs Adams at breakfast club. Breakfast club starts at 7.35 each morning. Payment is £1.50 each day and can be made via Parent Pay. Children enjoy cereal and/or toast and a drink and enjoy a range of activities.



Children have enjoyed riding their scooters to school during last year. This will continue with a slightly altered timetable.

Monday - Year 1, Tuesday - Year 2, Wednesday - Year 3, Thursday - Year 4, Year 5, Friday - Year 6.

Children must wear a helmet and we ask them to push scooters into and out of the school playground at the start and end of each day.

We also now have a bike shelter. Children who have passed their cycling proficiency are welcome, with your permission, to cycle to school and park their bikes safely. Any younger children who wish to ride their bikes must be accompanied by an adult on their journey to school. All children must wear a cycle helmet. Thanks to the dedication of Faye and Irene in our kitchen, we introduced a new element to lunchtimes last year.

'Build a butty' is proving really popular and gives children the opportunity to choose a sandwich instead of the hot lunch. They can still help themselves to the salad bar and puddings and fruit. Sandwich fillings vary each day with options including cooked meats, tuna, cheese and on the odd occasion - jam!!

Don't forget we are always on hand to support you to apply for Free School meals if you are eligible.

If your child is bringing a packed lunch, please remember that due to some children with allergies, we ask that no food contains nuts. We promote healthy eating at Willaston so also ask that children do not bring sweets/fizzy drinks in their lunchboxes.



Just a reminder. Some children in our school have severe allergies. In order to keep them safe, we ask that children do not bring in cakes or sweets to share with the class, or that re-cycled boxes etc. sent in for craft activities are not food packets. Thank you.
