Early Years Foundation Stage



Our Foundation Stage Curriculum allows children to learn by exploring, talking about their learning, practising skills and being active.

It is important to us that your child is happy at school and from their first days with us in Reception, our children enjoy exciting, engaging learning experiences alongside their peers, enabling them to feel safe, secure and confident in their new environment.

Key Stage One

A broad and balanced curriculum is provided in Key Stage One, with exciting and engaging learning opportunities taking place within the classroom environment, the outdoor learning spaces and beyond into the local environment. Throughout this phase, we aim to promote positive attitudes towards learning, making it fun, exciting and enjoyable with specific focus given to phonics, reading, literacy and mathematical skills.



- In Key Stage One, children are provided with a broad and balanced curriculum through a range of exciting and engaging learning activities in and outside of the classroom.
- Calm yet stimulating learning environments.
- Thematic approach to help children make links in their learning.
- Whole class reading and guided reading sessions to develop skills and promote a love of reading.
- Develop and foster positive attitude towards learning, valuing all contributions whilst meeting their individual needs.
- Learning about our community as well as the wider world.
- Keeping ourselves active and healthy.
- At the core of Key Stage One the children will be developing their literacy, phonics and numeracy skills.
 The children will learn these skills through a fostering of enjoyment, perseverance and determination to succeed.







Key Stage Two



Throughout Key Stage Two we continue to provide a broad and balanced curriculum through our thematic approach. Carefully planned, quality teaching and learning activities promote a love of learning, celebrate high expectations and spark curiosity and creativity.

KEY FEATURES:

- Calm yet stimulating learning environments.
- Development of a 'Growth Mindset' with opportunities for children to direct their own learning, set themselves goals and challenge themselves.
- Teacher, self and peer assessment.
- Daily phonics and spelling sessions.
- Whole Class Reading and Guided Reading sessions to develop skills and promote a love of reading.
- Development of writing composition strategies through Talk for Writing, modelling and shared writing.
- Sentence construction skills (including grammar) developed through extensive practice,
- A deeper understanding, confidence and competence in Mathematics through a 'Maths Mastery' approach.



- Regular times tables practice.
- A combination of formal teaching and collaborative learning activities.
- Celebration of our culture, language and heritage.
- Keeping ourselves active and healthy.
- Learning takes determination but is fun and rewarding!

Snacks and Drinks

Children are welcome to bring in a healthy snack to eat at playtimes. This could be fruit, vegetables or breadsticks etc. We do ask that item with nuts in is **not** brought into school as we have several children with severe allergies.

All children are provided with their own cup in school and encouraged to drink regularly from our water coolers.



We provide hot and healthy dinners at Willaston School which are paid for via Parent Pay. Dinner menus are emailed to all parents and displayed by the school office. The children have two options to chose from daily as well as having access to our lovely salad bar. If you prefer your child to have packed lunch, we would just ask that no fizzy drinks or energy drinks are included. We also ask that no items with nuts are included as we have several children with severe allergies.

School Uniform

Our pupils wear uniform from Reception through to Year 6. Navy blue school sweatshirts, featuring our school logo, should be worn over red polo shirts. They are worn with black or grey school trousers, black or grey shorts or black or grey skirts. In the summer, girls may wear red or blue checked cotton dresses. Children are to wear black shoes.

PE Kit

All children require black shorts, a white t shirt and pumps for indoor activities.
